St. Valentine's Day and Ash Wedesday fall on the same day this year. This combination only happens once or twice a century at ...most. A cross of ashes is given to us upon our forehead with the words, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." On the same day this happens, sweethearts exchange flowers, chocolate and Valentine cards with expressions of undying love. It

seems like a strange combination, doesn't it?

On the surface ashes and valentines don't seem to go together ... but they do.

The cross of ashes is made in the same place the cross was made upon our forehead when we were baptized. That cross is barely visible, the sheen of the oil with which is it made is fast fading evidence of its presence. On Ash Wednesday it is made visible again... this time traced with ashes made from Palm Sunday palms.

It is a solemn and moving thing to receive these ashes... and there is no more appropriate day to receive them than on St. Valentine's Day. Why? Because Christ is God's love made visible; and the cross upon which he hung is a far more appropriate symbol of love than a heart with a lacy border. Jesus sacrificed himself on the cross to bridge the gap between us and God. He gave his life

so that we might have life forever in eternity ... and an abundant life here and now. There is no greater love expressed for each one of us that that.

As for the love we share with one another, the scripture reminds us that "We know how to love because God first loved us." (I John 4:10) All the truest and greatest gifts we will ever receive come from God. It is by appreciating and staying in touch with that that we deepen our faith. It is with a deep faith that we lead deeper and more joyful lives. The price Christ paid to bring us these things was terrible... but he was willing to pay it because that's how much he loves us.

The cross, therefore, is the first and greatest Valentine of all... one that we continue to receive every day.

Two Hearts by Cynthia Rutledge (3)

From Princess To Pauper . . . To Wife? After a disappointing relationship, heiress Libby Carlyle need to change her life. So she winged a prayer heavenward and traded places with her less privileged best friend. No sooner did she step into her new waitress shoes than Libby fell in love with her very stern, very handsome boss, Carson Davies. If she could only find a way to reveal her true identity . . .

Determined to succeed, Carson ran himself ragged and relied only on himself. When he looked up from his blinders, he noticed a beautiful woman working for him. Suddenly, he wanted to be with her and share her faith in God. But did he dare trust these budding feelings, or the voice inside that urged him to believe?

Two-Part Invention by Madeleine L'Engle (4)

Since her debut with The Small Rain in 1945, L'Engle has continued to write critically acclaimed books for adults and young readers, including a Newbery Medal-winner, A Wrinkle in Time. But this story of her marriage surpasses her best work so far. Starting with accounts of her childhood, she describes her life as a young woman in Manhattan, attracted to the theater and landing a job as an understudy touring with Eva Le Gallienne and Hugh Franklin. L'Engle and Franklin married in 1946, creating a bond that was broken ony by his death 40 years later.



Burden Bears


