I pray that the sweet smells, sounds, and sights of summer fill you with God's promise of healing and renewal for the world. I pray that you sense God at work among us when you notice life sprouting around you, for God is not done with us yet.

CONGREGATION MEETING MINUTES

JUNE 19, 2022 @ 9am

Meeting called to Order. Quorum met with 29 voting members .

Jeff, Council President opened with a prayer at 9:08 am.

LACE Scholarship - LACE presented the following 3 scholarship applicants which were approved by Council:

Calaway Alderson - Milwaukee School Of Engineering - Mechanical Engineering

"Core" Molly Miller - UW Whitewater—Bachelor of Fine Arts—Performance

Olivia Radebaugh – UW Stevenspoint - Major in Marketing / Minor in Data Analytics

A motion was made to approve the 3 scholarships as presented by Julie Hansen. The motion was seconded by Caitlin Webster. It was put to a voice vote and there was a 27 yeses and 2 abstains.

<u>2022 Budget Review -</u> Simply put the giving isn't covering our expenses. In the past years a member gave a yearly substantial amount of money but that is done. We don't have a lot of options - the memorial team is working on covering some of the building repair needs. Council went to LACE and asked for 10K to cover this years budget shortfall. The LACE committee approved but to do this we need to change the LACE by-laws section A—Plan Of Operation (last paragraph).

Presentation of the ByLaw amendment change - Special distributions deemed necessary for the continued operation of Bethania Lutheran Church and therefore the continued benevolence of the Bethania LACE Fund are allowed and require the recommendation of the Bethania LACE Fund Committee, the recommendation of the Congregation Council, and a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the voting membership present at a Congregational Meeting.

Discussion was had.

A motion was made by Kelly Imhoff to amend the bylaws of the LACE Fund as presented. The motion was seconded by Caitlin Webster. It was put to a voice vote and there was a unanimous yes.

Presentation of the 10K outlay to cover the 2022 budget shortfall.

Discussion was had.

A motion was made to approve the 10K outlay as presented by Julie Hansen. The motion was seconded by Robin Barnes . It was put to a raised hand vote and there was a unanimous yes.

Well Being of Our Church -

Pastoral Options - we do not have a lot of options for a Pastor. Option #1: Continue as we are with Pastor Allison or Option #2: All supply Pastor. Council recommends continuing with Pastor Allison.

Discussion was had.

Also noted was that we could look at hiring a vicar for 20 hours and getting them ordained. Pastor Allison had mentioned Vicar Debbie Hartfield as a possibility. We would need to do more research on this and meet with the Vicar.

A motion was made by Kelly Imhoff to continue with Pastor Allison for 1 year. The motion was seconded by Neils (Chris) Stauersbol. It was put to a voice vote and there was a 27 yeses, 1 No and 2 abstained.

Other Discussion from the Wellbeing coffee hours: Streaming of the service—clearer instructions must be given. We need to look at close captioning for the hard of hearing. We also need to ask Pastor Allison to remove her mask when she is up in the chancel area as it is hard to understand and hear her with the mask on. She can wear it for distributing communion and processing/recessing.

Julie also mentioned we should do a potluck or brunch with Pastor Allison to help us to get to know each other.

Old Business: Jeff & Caitlin talked about the happens at Synod Assembly.

Quorum question: We need to vote at 2 ANNUAL congregational meeting to change our quorum amount and add the voting options. We will still need 25 voting members in January to make the change.

New Business: None

Move to Adjourn:

A motion was made by Brad Larsen to adjourn the Semi Annual Congregational Meeting. The motion was seconded by many of the members present. It was put to a voice vote and there there was a unanimous yes.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:19 a.m.

GUN VIOLENCE THROUGH MY EYES

School shootings, drive by shootings, cemetery shootings, night club shootings and the list goes on. So much violence, so much hate, and so much fear.

The season of fireworks is here; along with all the shooting. People are living in fear and are scared. Many do not know the difference between fireworks and gunshots. It's so hard to tell. Is that a blessing or a curse? It's curse for the police department because they can't seem to cover all the calls, it's a blessing because people haven't been exposed to guns, gun violence, or war before.

I have been exposed to gun violence in October 2009, Keith and I had just got out of the car at Walmart when we heard "pop, pop, pop". I man 2 car aisles over had been shot by another man. Due to his career field (Firefighter/EMT) Keith told me to run take cover in Walmart while he ran to the shooting victim and helped him inside. I still can't tell you what I bought that day but it was a couple years before I was able to go to Walmart and I still get nervous when I go there. Such a normal activity and yet it was shattered.

February 26, 2020 is another day I will never forget. I was in the church office talking with Pastor Heather and I got a text from my daughter. "Mom, there is an active shooter here at work" – then nothing. We turned on the news, and there was a lot of scattered information. Pasto Heather called Froedert to alert them of possible incoming patients. My cousin also worked at Miller so I texted his wife. She had heard the same from him, but nothing more. Finally after an hour or so went by we got texts that said they were fine but to help us out we asked them to find each other so we knew visually they were actually fine. I got a picture of an area where they were secured at – a lunch room with as many employees put in there as they could get. It was the safe zone. As they (the police) found employees they took them to the safe zone. The relief I felt that day when she called me on her drive home was not as much as it should have been because my child was emotionally and mentally scarred that day. The child who had served 4 years in the US Navy. She knew everyone involved in the shooting – the victims and the shooter. The victims were her mentors and her friends. I went to the funerals and the active shooter counseling sessions with

her. To this date she makes sure that there is an active shooter emergency plan and a good one where she works. She has even revised a few because it wasn't a good plan. She has changed jobs a few times since she left Miller as it wasn't easy to go back for her. The long term affects on the employees and their families will be with them for a lifetime.
