t's the Christmas season as I write this.

With Christmas we all think of gifts and giving. Even though this is far from my first Christmas season of giving, I recently experienced a different outlook on what giving means to me. It all came about with Bethania hosting the meal-site this December.

As all of you know, there is a lot of work that goes into hosting the meal-site. There are all the requests for help with food donations and monetary donations. A personal visit to order the entrée and ensure arrangements for when and where the food will be picked up has worked best. Collecting up the sides, water, and utensils requires visiting several stores. Just like grocery shopping, there is no one store where you can get everything.

The real work begins just before the meal is served. Numerous containers have to be carried from the restaurant out to the car. Then, at the site, carried again down to the basement of Living Faith Church. In what takes a short time but great effort, the containers are spread out and each filled with their

portions making sure there is enough for all. Filled containers are placed on carts and taken up to the back entrance of the church for distribution.

This at times is hectic and frustrating. Fighting doors with your hands full can test tempers. Food in and out of vehicles is equally challenging for tempers. Worrying about keeping the car clean as food is transported adds to the stress. The pace to get the food in the containers is fast to do our best that the food is still hot when given out. By the time I got up to where the meals were being distributed, I was wondering why I was putting myself through all this. And that is when my bad attitude changed.

Outside of the door of the church was a line of people waiting for food. They would enter one at a time and announce how many meals they need. Some were happy with just one meal, and they would walk off to where they were going to eat. An elderly lady that is a friend of my family was there and asked for two. She got her meals from my son Jerod with a loving hug as well. Another lady asked for thirteen meals for her family and with our help we loaded her car. After she left, we got the story of how the husband and wife were caring for eleven children in their extended

family all resulting from other family members being unable to parent them. This was why we give. Seeing the line of needy and hearing the stories wasn't new to me but somehow, it reassured me that good was being done and the struggle to make it happen was really all worth it.

We had new help this last meal-site. Jerod's fiancé helped with the food. It was her first time doing so with our family. While I was having my reinforcing experience, this was new to her. She was taking great interest in the people that were coming forward for food. Hers was a fresh outlook of what was taking place full of people watching and making the extra effort that everyone got what they needed. The two of us were at different ends of the giving experience yet still working together.

I had a similar experience with the giving tree. There is a lot of effort that goes into finding the items for a young man at Bethany Apartments. Dealing with finding items at different suppliers and dealing with goofy delivery schedules is frustrating. But when everything is together and being wrapped up, it sinks in that there will be a happy little boy when he opens the present and it all seems worth it. Thread By Thread yields numerous stories of where the volunteer's efforts all make sense when a patron shares how Thread By Thread made a difference in their life.

That brings me to how similar giving experiences are available to all at Bethania. For months, I have been announcing to Bethania that we need volunteers. What we need is giving.

Bethania could use help with being a lector, reading lessons during the service. Bethania could use ushers, helping to greet those attending services. Bethania could use coffee hour hosts, welcoming people with coffee and snacks. This is all giving. Giving of your time mainly. And it will all be rewarded with smiles from others that appreciate your efforts. Just let myself or the office know and you will get the help you need to do well. The reward for giving comes with the pleasure it brings others.






