

Dear People of Bethania,

We live in extraordinary times - that sometimes feel perilous. My passion as a preacher is that I believe we have a gospel, good news, that's up to the challenge of the times. But only if we unlearn some of the things we may have been taught and relearn them with the guidance of gifted scholars and writers.

The past several weeks have brought a goldmine for me with new books from three of my favorite teachers. I'd like to tell you about the one I received and read in Arizona this week, while on vacation. It's by a New Testament seminary professor and one of his students -Douglas Campbell and Jon DePue, respectively.

Before telling you a bit more about the book, though, let me say something about one of the things I've found I need to unlearn and relearn. Growing up Lutheran I was taught about sin in a way that might block our having good news which can meet the challenge of our times. When we face times that are perilous because of human sin, what I learned about sin seemed to limit our options to make things better. I wasn't taught to believe that Jesus can actually help us become better human beings and then invite others to join with us in trying to tackle the problems of sin.

It's a bit like Alcoholics Anonymous and the Twelve Step program to recovery. It begins with Step 1: admitting that you don't have the power to beat alcohol on your own. But if there was no belief that one could make progress toward a life of sobriety with the help of the A.A. community and one's "Higher Power," then there would be no point to the program. Over the past 100 years of A. A., there certainly has been a point to it, as millions of lives have been changed for the better. You might even say saved.

Growing up Lutheran it seemed that our theology of Justification by grace through faith gives us the promise of forgiveness of our sins and a changed life in heaven after we die. But it often seemed that the hope of making true

progress against sin, and then experiencing significantly improved lives, came with significant limits while on this earth and in these bodies. This has seemed especially true of our corporate lives.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE January 28, 2024 CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

★ We had a quorum of 26 voting members.

➡ Jeff opened the meeting at 10:46 a.m.

How we will cover the deficit will be covered later in the meeting. A Motion made by Julie Hansen to accept the budget as presented. Seconded by Anne Woodward. The motion passed with 100% agreed.

★ Jeff asked for nominations from the floor for Council members, LACE Members, Memorial members and Synod Assembly representatives. No one stepped forward for council, Mike, Brad and Julie stepped forward for LACE, No members were needed or stepped forward for Memorial and Brad and Jeff stepped forward to be representatives at Synod Assembly. A motion was made to accept these nominees as presented. It was seconded. The motion passed with 100% agreed.

★ <u>Old Business:</u> None.

★ <u>New Business</u>:

Pastoral Pact (Contract) - We are not calling a Pastor but we are making a PACT (Contract) with Pastor Paul Nuechterlein. We negotiated a 25% time. He will give us 3 Sundays a month, assist in worship planning, will do marriages and funerals, Pastoral care, council meetings, bible studies, etc. He will assist the cares and concerns team and will have a planned out calendar. He will not oversee staff or meet with the Synod. He comes with 38 years of experience and has lowered his salary to meet our needs. A motion was made by Kelly Imhoff and seconded by Erik Hansen The motion passed with 100% agreed.

LACE Outlays: Since we knew we had a deficit budget we were proactive in talking to the LACE committee and the Council.

We are seeking approval from the congregation for an outlay of \$32,936.00 to cover the Pastoral Benefits. There was a bit of discussion.

A motion was made by Julie Hansen and seconded by Anne Woodward. The motion passed with 100% agreed.

We are seeking approval from the congregation for an outlay of \$13,500.00 to cover the Insurance. There was a bit of discussion.

A motion was made by Anne Woodward with the stipulation of only if needed. and seconded by Kelly Imhoff. The motion passed with 100% agreed.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 12:07 a.m. by Kelly Imhoff and Seconded by Erik Hansen. The motion at passed with 100% agreed.

St. Paul's Good News is about God sending Jesus to show us how to be human in a new way, and then with the help of the Holy Spirit we can ourselves begin to participate in Christ's new way of being human. This includes the corporate ways of being human. I really look forward to learning together this better way of understanding Paul's Gospel hopefully, just in time to help our neighbors and fellow citizens in learning how we might better meet the challenge of these times.
