## Dear People of Bethania,

Why am I talking so much about Christian Nationalism in sermons? The short answer: I love our country. And, as we celebrate the 248<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, I feel that the grand experiment with democracy, begun on that 4<sup>th</sup> of July 1776, is under threat to authoritarian forces. Those who seemingly choose the authoritarian path are doing so because they value something more: the power to be in control and have their vision for the country forced on others. Their stated reason for making such a **choice is, "We are a Christian nation." But what they truly want to force on everyone is** *their version* **of a "Christian nation"** – something our founding fathers were weary, and wary of when they instituted a separation of church and state in the Constitution.

Which brings me to a second, more important reason why I'm talking about Christian Nationalism in my sermons: I love the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Jesus even chose the word "Gospel" to make it clear that what he was doing was bringing a distinct alternative to the usual human politics of authoritarian imperialism. "Gospel" was a term used by Caesar to proclaim the "Good News" of his militaristic rule. Jesus co-opted the word "Gospel" to proclaim the coming of God's reign on earth, a reign with a decidedly different politics. If we are to properly proclaim the Gospel in our time and place, then we need to know what God's politics are. And how they are different from the typical human politics of authoritarian, militaristic rule.

This is where my love of country and love of the Gospel come together. I truly believe that the first major step away from the typical human politics, which have such a heavy death toll, is the American experiment with democracy. This is the first time in the history of so-called human "civilization" that a nation has chosen to move away from authoritarianism with such a long-term commitment to the ideal – not yet attained – of a nation who treats *all* people as created equal. From my perspective, we've made significant progress toward that ideal over the last 50 years, beginning with the Civil Rights and Women's Movements. But those who would vote for a return to authoritarianism in November are, in my opinion, choosing to give up on that experiment altogether. This week, someone posted on the Synod e-mail stream a sermon against Christian Nationalism by a young preacher in Texas, James Talarico. Here's how he sums up what I'm saying here in this column:

Jesus could have started a Christian theocracy, but love would never do that. The closest thing we have to the kingdom of heaven is a multi-racial, multicultural democracy, where power is truly shared among all people — something that's yet to exist in human history. Christian Nationalism is not only a threat to the American experiment in democracy, it's also a threat to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I would like to leave copies of this sermon on the table in the back of the sanctuary, as another discussion-starter for the kind of conversation we need to continue having over the coming months – perhaps the most important time in our nation's history, as we face the possible end of the democratic experiment. To me, it also helps bring clarity to the Gospel itself. To understanding the very different politics of God's reign that we pray for every time we pray the Lord's Prayer: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."



Our Sympathy to Anita Nielsen and family on the passing of her cousin Judy. Judy passed away on June 21, 2024.




